**DEFINITION**

Under direction, perform skilled work in painting, redecorating, and surface preparation; perform semiskilled and skilled functions in other maintenance trade areas; and do other related work as required.

**ESSENTIAL FUNCTIONS**

Use brush, roller, ~~or~~ spray equipment, **and texture equipment** in applying paint, **polyurethanes, varnish, shellac, enamel,** lacquer, and other protective and decorative finishes to a variety of surfaces, including wood, metals (**ferrous and non-ferrous**), glass, plaster, stucco, wallboard, brick and cement; scrape, sand, and fill surfaces in preparation for painting or repainting; apply undercoat and finish coats to a variety of surfaces; ~~size and tint plaster walls and other surfaces;~~ refinish furniture, automotive and general equipment; erect, rig, move, and work from scaffolding ~~and~~ platforms, **scissor lifts, and boom lifts**; clean brushes, **rollers, and** tools and maintain a variety of painting equipment; ~~paint simple signs;~~ **create standard signage and desk plates**, mix paints, match blends, harmonize and contrast color; may lay out and stripe athletic courts, ~~and~~ parking lots, **and play surfaces**; **may create and use stencils**; plan, organize, and lay out painting related tasks; may operate sandblasting equipment; requisition and maintain an adequate inventory of supplies, materials, and equipment; drive a service vehicle to and from work sites; **may tow trailers or other paint related equipment**; install and replace all types of window materials; remove graffiti of all forms from building surfaces, parking lots, sidewalks, and other surfaces; may be required to repair windows, securing them during off hours in the event of vandalism or break-ins.; ~~produce signs, desk plates, badges.~~

**EMPLOYMENT STANDARDS**

**KNOWLEDGE AND ABILITIES**

**Knowledge of:**

Methods, materials, tools, and equipment used in painting, tinting and finishing work;  
Methods of preparing different surfaces for painting ~~and~~ repainting, **and texturing**;  
Safe working methods and procedures.

**Ability to:**

Skillfully mix paint and match colors;  
Safely erect and work from **ladders, mechanical lifts**, riggings, and scaffolding;  
Determine the existence of asbestos and lead;  
Accurately estimate labor and material costs;  
Maintain simple records and prepare complete and concise reports;  
Understand and carry out oral and written directions;  
Establish and maintain an effective working relationship with those contacted in the course of work;  
Relate effectively with racially and ethnically diverse staff, students, and community.

**EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE**

**Education:**

Equivalent to the completion of the twelfth grade, supplemented by coursework or training in modern painting methods and techniques.

**Experience:**

~~One year of experience as a journeyman level painter.~~

**Three years of experience in commercial or residential painting.**

REQUIRED LICENSES AND/OR CERTIFICATES

Possession of a valid and appropriate California driver's license; have an acceptable driving record; qualify for insurability by the District's insurance carrier.

PHYSICAL REQUIREMENTS AND WORKING CONDITIONS

Strength:

Heavy work involving lifting, carrying, pushing and/or pulling of objects weighing up to 100 pounds with frequent lifting and/or carrying of objects weighing up to 50 pounds. Physical dexterity in limbs and digits to operate hand and power driven tools and equipment commonly used in the building trades, and perform strenuous manual labor; ability to bend, stoop, grasp and reach.

Working Conditions:

Duties may involve working off the ground using ladders, scaffolds and/or mechanical lifts.
